Policy/Criteria

Provider must submit documentation (such as office chart notes, lab results or other clinical information) supporting that member has met all approval criteria.

It is the policy of Buckeye Health Plan, an affiliate of Centene Corporation®, that SAVAYSA® (edoxaban), YOSPRALA™ (aspirin/omeprazole), and ZONTIVITY® (vorapaxar sulfate) are **medically necessary** when the following criteria are met:

I. Initial Approval Criteria

A. Prescribed indication is FDA-approved or supported by standard pharmacopeias:

1. Documented therapeutic failure of **two** preferred medications within the same class, each used for 14 days at up to maximally indicated doses unless one of the following are met: (a, b or c)
 - a. Allergy to medications not requiring prior approval
 - b. Contraindication to or drug interaction with medications not requiring prior approval

- c. History of unacceptable/toxic side effects to medications not requiring prior approval

Approval duration: 12 months

NOTE: Approval duration: 35 days for Xarelto 10mg tablets after hip replacement surgery

II. Diagnoses/Indications for which coverage is NOT authorized:

- A. Non-FDA approved indications, which are not addressed in this policy, unless there is sufficient documentation of efficacy and safety according to the off label use policies – CP.PMN.53 for Medicaid or evidence of coverage documents.
